The Department of Methodology of the Interdisciplinary Study of Man at the Institute of Philosophy of RAS invites scholars to discuss the problem of human choice in the modern world. Research of this interdisciplinary subject concerns different areas of disciplinary knowledge: philosophical anthropology, philosophy of science, social philosophy, sociology, philosophy of religion, history and philology, axiology, psychology, conflict resolution research, bioethics, modern problems of biomedicine, theory of communication and decision making, and many others that study man.

This problem was discussed in May 2013 during the “pilot” conference “Situation of human choice in the transforming modern society” (Institute of Philosophy of RAS, Department of Methodology of the Interdisciplinary Study of Man, Saint Petersburg State University, Department of Philosophy of Religion and Religious Studies http://iph.ras.ru/konf_sv.htm).
